Series 2: Dorothea Malm Collection

Historical note:

Dorothea Malm was an historian and volunteer at the Westport Historical Society. From the 1970s through 2000 she participated in a WHS project entitled House History and Genealogy Survey. As part of this project, houses designated as “historic” were identified by the placement of a plaque near the front door recording the initial date of construction. For much of this same period Malm did research in preparation for writing a history of Westport and for giving lectures and tours at WHS.

Malm files related to shipping and a collection of vintage advertisements were previously relocated to Record Group 5, Westport Business and Commerce Records.

Series 3: Lucinda J. McWeeney Collection

Historical note:

Lucinda McWeeney was born September 4, 1946 in Johnson City, NY. She received a BS in education, textiles & clothing, housing & design, from Cornell University College of Human Ecology, an MA in education and American studies, Fairfield University, a certificate in avocational archaeology, Norwalk Community College, an MA in archaeological studies and a PhD in anthropology, Yale University.

McWeeney joined the Westport Historical Society in 1976 to work on the survey of historic homes and the bicentennial quilt. She became a guide for the Jennings Trail and subsequently became chairperson of the Education Committee. In the early 1980s she was vice president of WHS and was involved in the restoration of Wheeler House. Before digging commenced for the vault construction McWeeney conducted an archaeological survey of the property, leading to the photos and artifacts from that project. (Artifacts are cataloged separately from this collection.) In 1985 she started an archaeological survey around the Cobblestone Barn and the Town Common.
