SUMMARY: The Coley Family Papers document a family that was prominent in Westport's history.

HISTORICAL NOTE:

The Coley family settled in northern Westport in the area now called Coleytown more than 200 years ago and farmed the land, growing grapes, flax, corn, onions and other crops. David Dimon Coley established the Coley homestead in what is now Weston in 1834 and five generations of the Coley family stayed in the homestead. The Coleys had a wharf on the Saugatuck River from which they transported produce by boat to New York and Boston. Their gristmill, built circa 1760, became a cotton mill by 1840. Coleytown Road was the center of a small village that included a green, schoolhouse, shoemaker, blacksmith, yarn manufacturer, horse stables, 5 Coley homesteads, and possibly other shops.

James Edward Coley (1832-1916) was an Episcopal priest who graduated from Trinity College and Berkeley Divinity School. He was ordained as a priest in 1859 and served churches in New London, New Haven, Wilton, and Hamden before returning to live in Westport. In his retirement Coley compiled a large memoir/scrapbook about his family's history.

William Bradley Coley (1862-1936) was a prominent bone surgeon and cancer researcher best known for his early contributions to the study of cancer immunotherapy. He made a discovery that laid groundwork for the modern medical field of immunology. He was born in Saugatuck, the son of Horace Bradley Coley (1829-1913), and graduated from Yale University and Harvard Medical School.

SCOPE AND CONTENT:

The core of this collection is a 700+ page volume titled "Historical Notes and Reminiscences of Old Saugatuck, Westport and Vicinity, with notices of old Houses and old Families," which was compiled by Rev. James Edward Coley. The original of this handwritten work with illustrations was presented to the Connecticut State Library in 1936 but this collection contains both photocopies of the original and typed transcriptions, with an index.

The collection also contains an original notebook of James E. Coley, transcripts of a diary by Horace B. Coley and other writings by Coley family members that trace the history of the family. Articles by Helen Coley Nauts document and publicize the pioneering medical work of her father, William Bradley Coley.
