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Historical Note

Like many other towns in New England, Westport's roots are in the Native Americans who frequented this area years ago. Names such as Saugatuck, meaning mouth of the tidal river, and Compo (Compaug), the bear's fishing ground, come from the early Paugussett tribe.

The colonial settlers came from three surrounding towns – Norwalk, Fairfield, and Weston, parts of which comprised Westport. The river was the dividing line between Norwalk and Fairfield, and vital to farmers as a pathway to markets for their produce. A small community of wharves, warehouses, stores and a tavern grew up on both sides of the river to become the Village of Saugatuck. The first church built in Westport was the Green's Farms Congregational Church, in 1711, and it served as the focal point of all town activities, from running the schools to collecting the taxes.

After the Revolutionary War, the Village of Saugatuck began to grow as a shipping center. In the 1830s, Daniel Nash, a leading resident, together with 130 other villagers made an application to the Connecticut General Assembly to incorporate Westport as a town. The charter was granted May 28, 1835.

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Scope and Content of Collection

The Westport Places Collection includes documentation of bridges, roads, cemeteries, churches, temples, historic houses and buildings, parks, waterways, and other sites in Westport. The documentation is primarily printed material collected by the Westport Museum for History and Culture over the years, but does include some original manuscript material, as noted in the finding aid. Records related to the Green's Farms Congregational Church are in a separate record group, RG 18. Records related to Westport public schools are found in Record Group 2, Westport Town Records. Records related to businesses in Westport, including mills, are found in Record Group 5, Westport Business and Commerce. Photographs of places documented in this record group may be found in Record Group 13, Westport Photographs.

The Sherwood Mill Pond Preserve is located at 191 Hillspoint Road on the site of the former Allen's Clam House Restaurant. When Captain Allen's century- old shellfishing business and eatery closed, the property was put up for sale. To protect the site from developers, the town of Westport bought the property with the help of many local residents who donated nearly half the funds necessary to complete the purchase.
